Phillip Yancey once wrote a book entitled Church, Why Bother? When I saw that title, I began to ponder the question for myself. After all, why should I bother with church at all? Two thoughts came to mind. The first concerned the PERSON. My whole perspective on life changed because of the man named Jesus. Specifically, my posture toward the church was altered. I started "bothering" with church because He bothered with the church. He laid His life down so that those who believed in Him might have eternal life. He loved the church that much. She is His bride, His treasured possession. That is the primary reason I bother with the church. By the way, we are included in that number; we are a part of the church.
