# The Pastor's Perspective Dr. Reggie Bridges

Since I was a boy, my Sunday School teachers would talk about the Apostle Paul and his missionary journeys, and they would even adorn their classroom walls with various maps of his travels. Obviously, I soaked up what they said (for I was a diligent, young student!), but the places seemed so removed from my North Mississippi life. Even when I tried personally to retrace Paul's steps on the maps at the back of my Bible, the areas remained rather mystical and distant. But oh, how that changed over the last couple of weeks! Cities like Corinth, Ephesus, Athens, Philippi, and Rome are now much more vivid for me and my understanding of the great missionary work. The maps indeed have come alive!

I could write so much about my adventure; but rather, let me just share a few "takeaways" I had. First, my belief in the authority, accuracy, and clarity of Scripture was once again affirmed. Now be assured, I have always accepted the Bible as God's inerrant, infallible Word to us. There is no doubt! But as I traveled to the different cities Luke mentioned in Acts, I once again was amazed how that physician captured the many cities, customs, personalities, and culture of the area with such precision. Think of all the various places that are mentioned in the book of Acts . . . and all the people . . . and all the titles . . . and Luke is correct in every aspect of his record! That is tremendous! I mean I still don't understand all the customs of Dubach yet! From the existence of Demetrius' store in Ephesus (Acts 19:23-27) to the Corinthian inscription that confirms Erastus as the "city treasurer" (Romans 16:23) to the archaeological evidence that proves that the Thessalonians used the term politarchs to refer to their magistrates/leaders (Acts 17:6,8), the accuracy of the biblical witness is manifested.

Second, I was once again reminded of the relentless effort of Paul and his companions to take the Gospel to unreached areas. Stop

and pull out your map of his travels again. He covered thousands of miles! No airplanes . . . no cruise ships . . . no buses . . . no Ubers. After our lengthy trip, I was tired and worn. But can you imagine Paul? He just kept going because of the Gospel! Wow!

Third, I realized again our Lord is sovereign. Our God worked through pagan leaders, emperors, and kings like Alexander the Great in order to prepare for His Son's coming and the Gospel's advancement. He allowed the Greeks to spread their language so that there would be an international vernacular to communicate the good news of Jesus worldwide. He permitted the Romans to spread their peace (Pax Romana) and to build their roads so that the missionaries could take the life-giving message safely across the empire. Yes! **Our** King did that!

Fourth, I saw how the Gospel was/is "the power of God for salvation." Whether I stood at the Philippian river where the seller of purple, Lydia, was baptized, or on Mars Hill where the philosopher, Dionysius, came to Christ, I marveled in the Gospel's ability to transform all kinds of different people in the midst of an immoral, ungodly culture. To be honest, I took note how the cities reflected religious pluralism and moral debauchery; and yet, the Gospel still penetrated such a desperate landscape. (And it still can today!!)

Fifth, I was challenged to face whatever comes our way for Christ's sake. At the Philippian jail where Peter and Silas sang hymns during their imprisonment and at the Roman dungeon where both Paul and Peter were held before their execution, I was moved to recommit myself to endure for our Lord no matter what we face. Jesus is worth it!

I look forward to integrating my trip into my preaching from Acts over the next few weeks, and I hope it brings a richness with it. Oh, did I mention I am home? Praise the Lord! See you Sunday!
