The Pastor's Perspective Dr. Reggie Bridges

Have you ever paid off a specific debt? Maybe it was a car note that you had been paying every month for five years, or perhaps it was that thirty-year marathon you lovingly referred to as a mortgage. Do you remember how incredible you felt? The elation that overwhelmed you? I bet you were so overjoyed that you just wanted to go out and buy something else! Of course, I am kidding about that; but I cannot overstate how tremendous it is to know that your account is paid in full. No more payments, no more debt.

Now stay with me for a moment as we consider the spiritual payment that was made on our behalf to clear our accounts before God. According to the writer of Hebrews, Jesus Christ presented Himself as the necessary sacrifice to atone for our sins. Simply speaking, **all of us register a spiritual deficit on God's ledger**. We have all offended His will through our own sin, and we owe a debt that we could never repay. Therefore, God's Son voluntarily came to offer the one-time, sufficient payment to remove that sin debt.

You see, **our greatest need is not temporal; it is spiritual**! Money and skill can allow you to secure all kinds of earthly things, but those resources can never purchase eternal forgiveness.
