The Pastor's Perspective Dr. Reggie Bridges

Unspeakable. Unfathomable. Unimaginable. The horrific tragedy perpetuated this week in that small Baptist church down in Sutherland Springs, Texas, has stirred inexpressible emotions within Christ-followers everywhere. For the last few days, we have lived in the territory of shock, distress, and anger. No doubt, demonic influences demonstrated their strength by orchestrating the death of twenty-six churchgoers and by inflicting wounds upon approximately twenty more. The New York Times painted the grim scene: "Families, gathered in pews, clutching Bibles and praying to the Lord, were murdered in cold blood on the spot." As Satan witnessed the carnage, he must have celebrated the fulfillment of his purpose "to steal, kill, and destroy."

If that had been the end of the story, we believers would be miserable and pitied. But we know that Satan's apparent victory is just a false shadow! Remember Sunday morning's message on the resurrection of Jairus' little daughter? As we looked at that story, we left with two takeaways: 1) Jesus has authority over life; and 2) Jesus has authority over death. And while I knew that these truths would inform our daily lives, I didn't realize how applicable they would prove in this context. Our Lord continues to maintain sovereignty over all circumstances ... no matter how painful they are. He has the power to take the most evil acts (like the one in Texas) and redeem them for His glory! I don't always know how that will manifest itself, but I do know that God's glory will prevail in the darkest of moments. And what's more, the physical death of a believer is not the final punctuation of his/her existence. In fact, Paul determined "to be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord." Eternal life is eternal; nothing can change that! Not even an evil gunman's intent upon destruction! I am confident that those Christ-followers who died in First Baptist Church, Sutherland Springs, now enjoy a different dimension of eternal life as they experience Heaven itself. And the apostle goes even further! He reminds us that their physical bodies will be resurrected on that great, triumphant day of Christ's return! Evil may have appeared to achieve its victory this past week, but don't be fooled by this cowardly act. Jesus is the Victor already, and He holds authority over all!

I know many of you all are concerned about our church security, and I assure you that we continue to evaluate our procedures to maintain a safe environment. This week, our Security Committee will meet to discuss these issues specifically. But while we make plans to address our own safety, let me ask you to pray for your Southern Baptist brothers and sisters in Texas who are going through this pain right now. Implore God to grant strength, grace, and comfort to the families and friends who are suffering through this loss. Moreover, pray that the Gospel will shine forth from Sutherland Springs and that this senseless act will find purpose in the salvation of lost souls. And as we ourselves join together to worship and serve, let's do so with full confidence in Christ and with an even greater sense of faithfulness! See you Sunday!

I know you were as shocked and sickened by the shootings at First Baptist Church, Sutherland Springs, Texas, on Sunday as I was. I know you cannot imagine what that might be like. From a ministerial perspective, I would think that the pastor, who was not present during the service as he was out of town, is second guessing himself and wondering what he might have done if he had been there. Please pray for him in his personal loss as well as all the families in that church.

Let me tell you what we do at Temple each Sunday to try to prevent something like this from happening here. We have a sheriff's car parked prominently in front of the Sanctuary. There is a uniformed, armed deputy present during the 9 a.m. Blended Worship Service and in *the gathering* at 11:15 a.m. We have church members on golf carts in the parking lots, watching for suspicious activity. They are to call 911 if they see something potentially dangerous. We have members of the Security Committee, as well as licensed law enforcement officers attending each service and by church policy, many are armed. Many sit in specific seats so they have a good overview of the Sanctuary and *the gathering*, so as to detect potential threats. Security Committee Chairman, Kip Franklin, and I are always looking for ways to improve our security, and we communicate frequently.

I am not an eloquent speaker or writer so I am at a loss for words following this tragedy. This morning's blog by Dr. Thom Rainer, President of LifeWay, spoke eloquently to this, so let me quote him.

"But these things I will do:

- I will pray. I will pray for the families of those killed and wounded. I will pray for the church. I will pray for the community. I will pray for Pastor Frank Pomeroy as he leads and comforts his congregation in the midst of his own grief. I will pray for the shooter's family.
- I will trust God for His comfort, His promise, and His guidance for those affected.
- *I will pray for the Gospel of Jesus Christ to be magnified in this tragedy.*
- And I will embrace in spirit the members of First Baptist Church of Sutherland Springs. I will identify with my brothers and sisters in Christ.
- We are First Baptist Church of Sutherland Springs.
- We are your brothers and sisters in Christ.
- We pray for you. We care for you. We love you."


