The Pastor's Perspective Dr. Reggie Bridges

We now refer to them as "The Seven," a group of men who stepped up to serve the early church at a critical moment. Remember the story from Acts 6? As the number of believers grew, so did its needs. Unfortunately, some congregants (e.g. Hellenistic Jews) felt that they were being neglected in the midst of the growth. The solution? The Seven! The forerunners of deacons! These men were selected by the people to wait the tables of Grecian widows and minister to their needs. Through their service, the fellowship of the church was protected, and the ministry was furthered.

I am especially grateful for those brothers I call deacons here at Temple Baptist Church. They understand that initial responsibility of the deacon—to keep the fellowship of the church through service and ministry. For the past few years, I have served with some of the most solid, selfless deacons I have ever encountered. And this Sunday, we have an opportunity to nominate ten more such individuals to the Deacons Council. I ask you to pray fervently this week for guidance and discernment as you approach this decision. Read Acts 6:1-7 and 1 Timothy 3:8-13 to help you in the process. And finally, seek the Holy Spirit's prompting in your selection.

Luke reminded us about the powerful results of the first deacon election: "And the word of God kept on spreading; and the number of the disciples continued to increase greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were becoming obedient to the faith" (Acts 6:7 ESV). What an awesome statement! The choosing of deacons allowed the Kingdom to continue its advancement. Let's pray that God will use this week's deacon nomination also to multiply ministry and expand the Gospel's impact.

I am looking forward to gathering around the Word with you this coming Sunday as we seek Christ, the Healer! As always, I covet your prayers as I prepare His message. I want to ask you to go to God on my behalf and specifically request that He give me sensitivity and clarity as I share.

After we experience the renewal of worship and study Sunday morning, we get to serve our community through Released projects and through the "art of neighboring." Hope you are intentional in participating in that special time! See you Sunday!

A Peek Inside Wednesday Night Worship: Do you ever wonder what is happening during our Wednesday Night Worship? Well, I'm going to tell you. I love the big windows that allow more people to see that there's something happening in the Youth Room, but you need more than just a passing glance to see just how profoundly God is working in and through the lives of students.

Each week we have around 80 students from grades 7-12 come together for a worship service that is designed specifically for them. We usually start with a game that takes advantage of their energy, competitive spirit, socializing, and desire to be involved. Students don't want to just sit back and listen to a lecture. A well-designed game is crucial in helping students begin to engage with the evening's theme and set up the lesson they are about to hear from God's Word. Then, we have a group of 6-7 students who lead a time of musical worship by singing and playing in our Youth Praise Band. Many of our praise band members rotate from week to week and we have around a dozen students who are currently involved in leading music on Wednesday nights. The praise band is made even better with the students that work in the media booth to make sure that words to the songs are displayed properly and lighting on the platform frames the atmosphere for worship. The media team is trained by Andy Carter and will be ready to serve in our church-wide worship services because of how they have used their talents in our youth services.

Every week we examine God's Word together. I usually take the opportunity to speak to students, but they are also given opportunities to talk through questions and Scripture in smaller groups, pray for one another, and challenge each other. Some of our own students, who feel called to ministry, take advantage of Wednesday Night Worship as their first preaching experience! I'm always humbled by how students crave to hear truth from other students.

Students who come to worship with us are: openly seeking to find out for themselves what they really believe about God and Jesus Christ, doubting what they've been told for many years, firm in their beliefs but need to learn application of God's Word, or followers of Christ who are better disciple makers than most adults I know.

This last school year we had 8 different students make professions of faith in our Youth Room on Wednesday nights. We have students surrender to spend their next summer doing missions in a foreign country. We have students who commit to reaching their friends with the Gospel. We have students who feel left out and find a much needed friend. We have students who learn how to lead others and further develop their spiritual gifts.

You may not always see what's happening with our youth on Wednesday nights, but I promise that God is doing BIG and amazing things every week. Pray for Wednesday Night Worship that even more students will come to experience God and more closely follow Him.
