stepped up to serve the early church at a critical moment. Remember the story from Acts 6? As the number of believers grew, so did its needs. Unfortunately, some congregants (e.g. Hellenistic Jews) felt as though they were being neglected in the midst of the growth. And complaints abounded! (I told you we could trace our Baptist lineage back to the first century!) The solution? The Seven! The forerunners of deacons! These men were selected by the church to wait the tables of Grecian widows and minister to their needs. Through their service, the fellowship of the church was protected, and the ministry was furthered.

These men continue to offer us a clear example of the deacon servanthood that should be found in churches today. Indeed, deacons are to do whatever it takes to maintain the unity of the church, even if that means waiting tables. As my Mississippi buddy, Jim Futral, explains, "Deacons are 'problem-solving helpers'." Now, I know that Baptist deacons are not always viewed in such a positive light. To many, they are considered the problem. Don't forget that it was a Baptist college that chose a "demon deacon" as their mascot! But a genuine deacon




