# Holy Spirit provides for us

Jesus said He came "to set at liberty them that are bruised." Luke 4:18. Then Isaiah 55:10-11 tells us, "God promises to stand by every word He has ever spoken." What a promise!

How are we bruised? Maybe from past mistakes, by harsh criticism, by crippling fears, by wrong thinking, by physical, emotional, mental and spiritual handicaps.

No matter how bad our past has been, the future Jesus has in mind for us is better and it is worth pursuing and fighting for.

You see, Jesus said He and the Holy Spirit are identical in all of these ways. So whatever Jesus did is exactly what the Holy Spirit will lead you to do in every situation of life as you lean on His guidance and direction from within.

As we get to know Jesus better from the New Testament, it will prepare our hearts and minds to accept and walk in the freedom given by the Holy Spirit in our lives.

We should be emptied of self and filled with scripture and then take one step at a time as we go through the day.

J. Vernon McGee wrote: "As Christians, we have the Holy Spirit within us, enabling us to walk by faith. What does it mean to walk by faith? Every morning we should say 'Lord, I belong to You today. I ask for Your will to be done every moment during the next 24 hours. May I be filled with your Spirit so Jesus can live and work through me."

The whole Christian life, from the moment we are born again until we come into His presence, is a walk by faith, a faith that rests upon the indwelling Holy Spirit.
